

Recover and use parts of your hunting prey, and construct new, valuable objects out of materials you've collected. Achieve fame and honor with the success of your forays into the wilderness.

Accomplish your multifaceted missions in Indian Hunter and slay not only buffaloes, but wapitis and beavers too. Watch out, or the animals with their keen sense of smell and hearing will detect you. Beware of dangerous rattlesnakes, wolves, coyotes, and grizzlies—they're after you!



But there is the threat of danger from other tribes too:

- Hostile Crow Indians gravely wound your father, Akecheta. Only your healing skills, your cool-headed action, and your knowledge of prairie plants can save his life.





## Fauna

Our team at Scorpius Forge has not only devoted great care to detailed illustrations of the Lakota Sioux, our realistic renderings of the plant and animal worlds also wow gamers and convey knowledge about times past in a playful way.



You'll encounter sacred albino buffaloes, buffalo calves, wild Mustangs, grizzlies, prairie dogs, wapitis, wolves, badgers, turkey vultures, coyotes, red tailed hawks, and many other animals. They all possess different characteristics, react differently to you, and prove useful to you for different purposes. Learn about how they live, and adapt your ways of hunting and defense to each of them. Find the best strategies for a successful hunt. With classic Native American weapons you can hunt animals or defend yourself against them.

But careful--the animals have a sense of vision, hearing, and smell. They can sense your presence, run away or attack. The hunt is definitely no walk in the park!

## Flora

Our flora is also varied and invites you to extensive exploration. For what purposes did the Native Americans use quaking aspen, juniper, oat straw, the mighty bristlecone pine, and oak? What is so special about relatively little known plants such as dogwood, Jimson weed, or wild sage, which the Native Americans revered as sacred?



Which plants are useful for healing and, above all: which one can you use to save your wounded father?

Learn about them and help your father when he is wounded in the game.

# Gameplay

## Walk/Run and Combat Modes



Depending on the situation, simply choose the right way for your Native American character Chayton to move: in walk/run mode you can move in stealth, read tracks, or flee. In combat mode you can use various Native American weapons, to kill your prey or defend yourself.

## The Weapons



### Tomahawks

These throwing axes are the heaviest Native American weapons. They are not deflected by wind and weather, and close range targets can easily be hit with them. Their advantage lies in their great piercing force. They serve you especially well in close combat.

### Bow and Arrow

The bow and arrow can make your game life easier. Your arrows will fly a great distance and you won't need to enter the radius of the animals' sense perceptions. So the risk of being detected is low, but your arrows will be more strongly deflected by the wind. Make use of all your skills and aim precisely to become a successful hunter.

### Spear

The spear is a very elegant weapon. It combines a long range with a low degree of deflection through weather conditions. This makes it an optimum weapon for you particularly at the beginning of the game.

## Trajectory Preview



You can use the trajectory preview for each weapon to simulate its flight path. However, wind speed will not be factored in. Improve your feel for your natural surroundings and use the previews with care, because their number is limited.



## The Wind

The spears and arrows you send off are influenced by the current wind direction and speed. Wind directions are purely random, and the conditions of no wind, light breeze, and strong wind will have different effects on the flight behavior of the various weapons within each level. But clearly displayed wind symbols on the screen will give you valuable hints. Pay attention to them and become a master at marksmanship.

## Strike Zones



All animals have various specific body zones, each producing different effects when struck. The more precise your aim, the more swiftly you will kill an animal without it being able to flee first.



**STRIKE ZONE 1:**  
mortal strike – head, neck: the animal dies immediately.

**STRIKE ZONE 2:**  
shoulder/chest hit – flank, heart: two strikes result in death.

**STRIKE ZONE 3:**  
wounding – hind quarters: three strikes are needed to kill the animal; it flees with its wound.

## Animal Senses

All our animals possess a high degree of artificial intelligence. They can smell and hear you. If you get too close to them, they will react and either attack you or run away.



So use all your natural abilities and those skills you've learned: sneak up carefully so as not to be recognized immediately as an intruder.

If there is imminent danger and you must save your own life, escape is often the best solution. Dying is impossible in this game, by the way. Failure will require you to repeat the level.

## The Graphic & User Interface


Allow yourself to delight in the beauty of the prairie: move freely through our Native American open world with its compelling graphics. Interact with realistic avatars, animals, plants, and objects—all that within a captivating 3d-world. All control buttons and display surfaces are clearly arranged and easily located. Individual elements are explained through corresponding tutorials at each stage of the game. No jumpiness, no lagging--Evolution: Indian Hunter offers you a rivetingly smooth game-play experience that you'll long remember.



### Joystick

In the lower left-hand corner of the Head-Up-Display (HUD) you'll find the control button with which you can control your character, Chayton, with three different speeds (stealth, walking, running). With the Stealth-o-Meter you have the option of switching the user interface on and off.





On the right you'll see the point display, your weapons selection, and your current mode of play. You can toggle between “walk/run mode” and “hunt mode”. Here you can also see the direction from which the wind is blowing.

You control the game by using both your thumbs. Use your left thumb to move your character, with your right you control the camera view, take aim, and you can look around.

### Event Display

With these two buttons you can display or hide your HUD.



### Evaluation Feathers

The number of feathers shows you your performance at the end of a level. Only the best hunters achieve 5 feathers!



### Stealth-o-Meter

With the noise level display you can observe the effects of the sounds you make on your surroundings. When it moves into the red zone, the animals are guaranteed to hear you.



## Inventory

Gather medicinal plants and keep them for later, recover useful parts of your prey, find valuable materials and assemble them to make new objects. Your inventory offers you numerous opportunities to expand your gaming options and upgrade your character. Use them all and master your tasks with bravura.





For this you only have to combine the needed materials in the correct sequence.

You do this by touch dragging previously collected elements (wood, feathers, sinews) onto a set of instructions for building the object.


What results is a 3d-object which you can use in your game.
